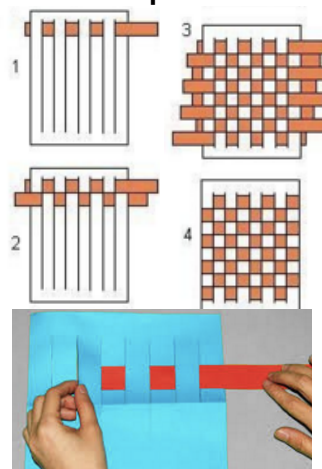

 She was a German textiles artist who produced colourful, exciting woven designs.
Gustav Klimt 1862-1918
 He was an Austrian artist. He had a 'Golden Phase' where he created lots of decorative paintings using gold leaf.

Vocabulary

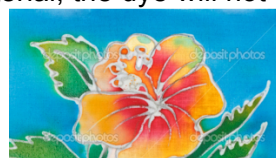
- **Textiles** – a type of cloth or woven fabric
- **Weaving** – some cloth is made using a technique called weaving. The frame you weave on to is called a **loom**. You weave strips of material over and under your loom until you reach the end, alternating each time. These are called the **weft** threads. The long threads on the loom are called the **warp** threads.



Activities

- Look at examples of weaving from around the world focusing on materials, patterns, colours and equipment used.
- Develop weaving skills by making a paper loom, weaving strips onto it.
- Learn about and comment on the work of the artists Gustav Klimt and Gunta Stölzl as inspiration for designing their own products.
- Design and make fabric coasters using the technique of batik.

- **Batik** – a technique used for dyeing (colouring) materials and creating interesting designs. First you draw a picture/pattern in wax. Then you dye (colour) the material. The wax **resists** the dye – this means wherever there is wax on the material, the dye will not work
